Please don't forget that we have class photos on Monday so ALL children need to come in full school uniform. If they have PE or Outdoor learning, then please bring a change of clothes.


Maples are heading into Oxford to visit a synagogue and spend some time at the Pitt Rivers Museum. I look forward to hearing all about this!

Prime Minister, Rishi Sunak, has announced that a UK general election is to take place on 4th July. He made the announcement in a press conference outside 10 Downing Street. Parliament was dissolved on Thursday 30th May, and the members of Parliament have returned to being members of the public. Many are campaigning to be re-elected. A general election is when people over 18 can vote for who they want to represent them in the UK parliament. It could mean a new government party and new leader for the LiK this summer.


Oak Class
