#### Communication

We always try our best to communicate as much information to you as possible and we know that sometimes it can be overwhelming! We have decided to focus on using dojo as much as we can, both from the classes and from the office, so we will now be sending our newsletter out fortnightly rather than weekly. We have purchased a large number of new scheme books (over 500) which have obviously cost the school a considerable amount of money so please take great care with them. The children are also expected to complete Doodle Maths over the duration of the week (Friday to Friday) and ensure they are in the 'green zone' by Friday when the class teacher will check it. If they do not complete this, they will be asked to do this at school during a break or lunch time.

Well done to everyone who has joined us at Morning Run this week, especially our new starters and Acorn children! This is our opportunity to 'run your sillies out' before school.


But you can also walk, skip or jog, and you can take your grown-up with you too.

Mr Smith arrived in early August and has started his teaching job. He is still getting used to the change in climate and the humidity!













## **Oak Class**


