Year 6 visit to Junior Citizens

During the Junior Citizens we got to look around a fire station, there were eight different simulations of what to do during an emergency.

During these we learnt about river safety, fire safety, train track safety, online safety and road safety. During these we got to call a fake simulation of 999 which made it feel a lot more real.

Room no.1

We were put in a room and had to spot all the fire hazards, such as, wires, cigarettes on flammable material and methods to fall over.

Room no.2

This was similar to room no.1 but we had to call a fake fire service where we had to tell them the flat address. This also included an oven that caught fire and had fake smoke.

Room no.3

We had to talk about river safety and what to do if someone fell in and how to help them.

What we learnt

We learnt that ourselves are the most important people to us and that we should help ourselves before we help others, which services to call.



Oak Class

This week in Oaks we began our new writing topic- writing a formal mission log based upon an Apollo mission to the moon. We have unpicked a variety of technical vocabulary from the WAGOLL and have focused on how relative clauses add extra information to our sentences. In Maths the Year 5s have been focusing on the difference between square and cube numbers while the Year 6s have recapped the formal written method of long multiplication and short division. In our Geography lesson this week we looked at 6 figure grid references and used the ordnance survey maps to find different places using our grid references. We also had a lovely open afternoon, it was great to see so many of you getting involved in our activities-dissecting the parts of a flower, locating places based on their longitude and latitude and many more.










Willow Class

Maples ready for outdoor learning – wellies, waterproof trousers and waterpoof coat are essential








Acorn Class
