Welcome back to school 2025!

The children have come back with such enthusiasm and ready to learn. It was lovely to hear so many children talking about their 'Brilliant Beginnings' day as they left school on the Tuesday after the Christmas break.

New Year, New Initiatives in school!!

We are having a real focus on reading this term. Just before Christmas the children (not Reception) took part in a range of assessments and once these were completed, we looked at how we can then support the children to ensure all children are progressing well. We noticed that for some children the main barrier was reading. We know that reading is a fundamental skill that impacts on all areas of the curriculum and is therefore vital to a child's education. As part of our homework policy, we ask that children read frequently at home (ideally daily) but we are also aware that some children are not always keen to read so we decided as a school to try a 'Reading Challenge' to hopefully encourage/inspire more children to be reading regularly. Instructions were posted on dojo on Tuesday

and we will be looking at each class's jar in assembly to see how things are progressing.



We also launched 'WOW- the walk to school challenge' last Friday. The children all seemed very enthusiastic after the assembly and we have already seen a decline in the number of cars in the morning and more children walking,



Our Year 4/5 children have also begun their art pieces for the Cotswold Arts in School project which then leads to an exhibition- Sculpture at Kingham Lodge. We are looking forward to working with Abigail (artist) and seeing our

sculptures transform ready for the exhibition in May.

The article is predominantly based in poor attendance in schools but as you scroll down, Middle Barton School is mentioned in a very positive way! 'At the other end of the scale, Oxfordshire schools with near-perfect attendance rates include Middle Barton Primary School and St Laurence CE School. Both primary schools recorded just two students – about two per cent of the total pupils – with persistent absences over 10 per cent and no absences beyond 50 per cent.' 




## **Oak Class**

We have had a great start to 2025 in Oaks Class. In Brilliant Beginnings we spent the day creating our own comic strips, beginning with deciding on our story line and exploring different characters to then creating our final design. The end results were fantastic! In Music this term we are focusing upon the traditional African song 'Shosholoza', in our first lesson we practised the song acapella style and this week began playing a chord progression on the keyboards. In English we began exploring our new text 'The Hound of Baskervilles', looking at the different cliffhangers within the novel to use as a model for our own cliffhanger narrative.

The children have started designing Web pages in computing - this was trickier than we first thought! Many of the children chose an animal theme to base their web pages on.

Willows have also continued their Romans topic and have enjoyed handling artefacts from the Oxfordshire Museum, including a scent bottle, coins, pottery, cosmetic implements and nails.

We had an exciting morning on Wednesday when a visiting artist called Abigail came to discuss our contribution to the Cotswold sculpture show. She showed us some of her previous work and we discussed the materials we may wish to use, focussing on recycling and not buying. We sketched out our ideas, which were amazing, including solar systems, underwater scenes and a variety of wildlife. Our next stage is to decide on which design to create..















## **Maple Class**

Maples have been getting back into the swing of it after Christmas. We have started learning about our great inventor this term - Louis Braille - and will be exploring this more in the weeks to come. Year twos have been exploring shape and some have begun working on their cursive handwriting. Year three are multiplying and dividing 2-digit numbers with exchanging!
