






Oak Class

Oaks have been busy this week researching influential Ancient Greeks. They worked in small groups and presented their findings to the class. In Writing they have been producing formal reports from the perspective of Watson in The Hound of Baskervilles, focusing upon the use of formal and old-fashioned language. In Maths, the Y6s have been looking at ratios and have applied this to real life scenarios such as recipes. The Y5s have been working out fractional amounts and finding the whole.









Willow Class

This week Willows have taken part in Bikeability and impressed us with their growing confidence and cycling skills. In English we have written an information guide on how to be a monster hunter and defeat a beast from Norse mythology. In French we have been learning to say 'I am able to' followed by a verb such as paint or swim. Je peux faire du vélo has been very apt this week. 














Acorn Class

Thanks to Amanda for arranging the donation of a fruit tree from Nicolsons.


